Requirements and Programming

As part of the James Patterson Honors Program, students are expected to take 4 honors or honors

events; and participate in professional development workshops, community engagement opportunities, and our Mentoring Program. As an added benefit, honors students receive priority

course registration and graduate with honors transcript recognition. To remain in the program

students must maintain a GPA of 3.2 or better. If they fall below that threshold, they must develop an action plan with the Executive Director of the program in order to remain in the program.

Ordinarily, students who receive Presidential and Trustees Scholarships will be invited to ioin

the James Patterson Honors Program upon their admission to Manhattan university. Invited

students must save their spot in the program upon committing to the university.
