# Five Year Program Adolescence Education B.S./Students with Disabilities M.S.Ed (Grades 7-12)

This program is designed for the undergraduate student seeking dual certification in Adolescence English or Math or Social Studies and Students with Disabilities Generalist Extensions in English or Math or Social Studies for Grades 7-12.

Students who complete the first semester of sophomore year with a cumulative index of 3.00 or better and grades of B or better in all Education courses may apply for admission into the five year B.S./M.S. Ed. program. Upon satisfactory completion of specific program requirements, and successful completion of the New York State Educating All Students test (EAS) and required CST exams, students will be recommended for initial certification.

Students complete the required sequence of undergraduate courses during freshman, sophomore, junior and senior year. In the fourth year, they also complete 12 graduate credits, and do not enroll in EDUC 408 or EDUC 406. In the fifth year, students complete 24 graduate credits. Five-year participants complete student teaching in a Special Education setting for 70 full days in their last semester of the program.

The BS/MSED program is 124 to 130 credits for the undergraduate program and 148 to 154 credits total with the 5th year. Total credits dependent on undergraduate concentration area requirements.
